## Welcome to Friends of Geraldine

Friends of Geraldine is a club for anyone who wants to get to know a few more people in Geraldine.

Faye McGunnigle and Larry Pullin fell into the roles of unofficial organisers and Faye explains, "It's a chance for newcomers to meet people; that's how it started, but now we are opening it up to people who are new to the town, are lonely or newly retired and don't know too many people."

The Foggies, or Friends of Geraldine, as some members call themselves, are mostly middle-aged or older and are an extremely friendly group. The main group meets once a month or so at various venues. However, many smaller groups get together informally to play scrabble, go for coffee or out to dinner.

The Foggies are an offshoot of the group started three years ago by Donna Auld, the then administrator at the Geraldine Community Resource Centre (GCRC) and Margaret Chapman GCRC volunteer receptionist. There was an influx of new residents to the town after the Christchurch earthquakes and the Newcomers Group evolved to welcome these and other incomers.

Faye joined the Newcomers Group shortly after moving to Geraldine and says, "Everyone who joined the Newcomers Group agrees it is the best thing we ever did. I now know more people in Geraldine than I ever did in all my 70-plus years of living in Christchurch."

The Newcomers Group met in one of the GCRC rooms and was very popular. Numbers increased so much that fitting into

one room became difficult and noisy.

Faye recalls Donna suggesting that some of the older members might like to set up their own group. So Foggies began in 2013.

"Our group meets regularly and we just introduce people around, and they can pick up with new friends. It has been really successful. One couple moved on again to Ashburton but still come back to Geraldine to attend dinners with friends they made through the group."

The original Newcomers Group is now in recession as Kerry Stevens, GCRC manager, explains, "We do not want to go into competition [with the Foggies] but will support them if we can. We will not duplicate services in Geraldine unnecessarily, but if the need arises in the future then we would consider starting another newcomers' group."

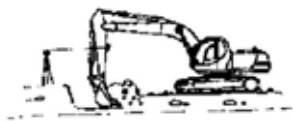

## FINANCIAL FOCUS: Investment year in review

In the New Year, we can look back at 2014 as another satisfying year overall in the investment markets.

As is so often the case, the performance of investment markets in 2014 told a very different story to that portrayed in some parts of the media.

In fact, if the only information we knew about 2014 was the performance of the investment markets, we would reasonably conclude that, economically and politically, the year must have been relatively incident-free.

Why? Because diversified investors saw their portfolios grow in every successive quarter and it would only be natural to assume that the economic environment enabling that to happen must have been accommodative.

However, if the only information we knew about 2014 was the daily news headlines, we would probably conclude that investment markets faced some very challenging times.

Throughout the year the major news stories lurched from the Russian annexation of Crimea in March, to the Russia/Ukraine crisis, ISIS attacks on Kurdish held territories in the Middle East, pro-democracy demonstrations in Hong Kong and ended the year with growing concerns that Greece may soon be forced to exit the Euro.

All the while, economic growth in most regions (New Zealand being a notable exception) remained disappointing. Dairy and oil process both fell precipitously in the second half of the year and there was even a series of high profile air disasters involving aircraft from Malaysian Airlines (twice) and Air Asia.

All in all, a fairly grisly resume of news but, thankfully, investment markets don't read newspapers!

When we review the results of leading market and asset class indices (which effectively assume that investments are well diversified in order to capture the broad returns available from each sector), then the overall returns make for pleasant reading.

- The New Zealand share market (the top 50 index) delivered a 17.5% return
- International developed share markets in aggregate

achieved between 10.9% and 13.2% returns, depending on whether the underlying investments were hedged back to the New Zealand dollar or not

- Listed property assets both domestically and internationally returned between 24.2% and 28.7% in a stellar year for the asset class
- High quality domestic and international bonds generally delivered between 5% and 7% returns depending on the specific mix (credit and duration) of the underlying holdings

While some market sectors disappointed, such as Australian shares and emerging markets shares, even these asset classes still managed to deliver small positive contributions to investors who had any exposure to them.

So what are the prospects for 2015? Well, plenty of people may care to speculate, but no-one can tell you with any certainty.

Market prices today are based on the collective interpretation of all the information already known to investors today.

What will impact the prices of securities tomorrow is not what we already know, it is new information that will only become known at some future date. Since I have no way of knowing what this future information will be, I can't tell you how markets will react to it.

However, I have no doubt 2015 will be another year where there is plenty of uncertainty, no shortage of scary news stories and probably a fairly normal amount of market volatility.

In that environment, maintaining a diversified exposure to high quality liquid assets and only taking a level of investment risk appropriate to your personal circumstances is always a prudent approach.

# Drew Brown returns from guiding scientists in Antarctica

Tripp Road resident ,Drew Brown is a veteran of seven Antarctic seasons.

He recently arrived home after a month in Antarctica mountaineering and guiding “an American scientific team of palaeobotanists and a geochemist interested in the evolutionary development of plants, looking for Permian and Triassic plant fossils.

“My job was safety in making decisions about anything from crossing crevasses to around the camp at Allan Hills and when going out,” he says.

“Allan Hills is about 115 miles from Scott Base, northwest of the Dry Valleys. That’s where the mother lode of plant fossils was. And Carapace Nunatak, where they’re in a chert [fine-grained, silica-rich sedimentary rock] layer, is another half hour by chopper from Allan Hills; returning to McMurdo means flying over the Dry Valleys.”

The ongoing research is an American project, “under the aegis of their National Science Foundation. The Universities of Kansas and Wisconsin-Milwaukee made a joint proposal for funds for the study,” and group members from America, France, Argentina and Canada returned to the field sites after visiting two years previously.

“In the 2012-2013 season we found a lot, but this time was a real surprise. They knew there should have been fossils there, of that age, but it was the first time they’d found so many fossils of the same age in one place: mass groupings, with different types of some plants. It was probably an oxbow in a river, where siltstone and plants must have been deposited in a quiet environment.

“The team was very excited; we ended up carting out 3,000 pounds of rock from Allan Hills.”

Altogether, between 5,000 and 6,000 pounds of rock were transferred to Kansas University where the collection and study of Antarctic fossil specimens is highly-resourced. The samples collected by Drew’s group are vestiges of temperate forest of the Permian Period (from around 300 to 250 million years ago).

Drew explains, “Antarctica hasn’t shifted much, while the rest of Gondwanaland has moved off. There were many forests there - you can see gigantic coal seams on Mt Fleming, for example - and they stretched across Pangaea. This is before the great extinction [marking the boundary of the Permian and Triassic periods].”

Where Allan Hills provided benign camping and working conditions on top of fossil wealth, Carapace Nunatak did not. “It’s at about 2,000 metres, it’s very cold, and a gigantic wind

scoops around it. It’s a very unpleasant place.” In October of the 2012-2013 season, the team experienced temperatures as frigid as -60C there. This time, in December’s relative warmth, they still endured occasional -30C conditions. However, Carapace Nunatak’s chert layer is generous with accessible, anatomically preserved plant material so at least 2,000 pounds of fossil-bearing rock were sent to Kansas University.

The long-term research programme informs many branches of natural science and some human sciences. “Palaeobotany gives relevance to geochemistry and palaeo-environmental studies. Everything’s linked.”

Environmental care and human-needs resourcing aren’t always compatible, especially on the ice, but Drew noted scrupulous guardianship at McMurdo and at Allan Hills, where “an environmental inspection team came out to make sure we were squeaky clean,” with nothing left in the field. “The Americans believe in not going short,” though. “They think big, but they don’t waste much, and they have a great work ethic. We had a magnificent Christmas meal in the big mess at McMurdo.”

Marveling at a “magically, impossibly green” New Zealand on return, Drew is pulled several ways when thoughts of another trip arise. Regardless, the scientists’ work continues: “They’re going back; the core of the team has a long-term commitment to the Antarctic.”
