# Poets young and old excel



These young writers shared their poetry at a candle-lit Geraldine and South Canterbury Poetry Competition awards ceremony at St Mary's church recently.

Organiser Jan Hill says, "There's definitely a need for a competition like this to encourage and nurture the deep thinkers, creative writers, and quirky humorists amongst us. It was so good to have more schools involved this year; a total of 12 schools entered 73 poems and there were 16 entries in the [awarded separately] adults' category."

The verse entered ranged from "deep" to "quirky", says Jan, with category-winning poems' subjects ranging from the existential to the matter of a fridge's size. Judges' comments on imagery, structure, restraint, storytelling, and more show that, as ever, the unpredictable chemistry between linguistic skill and artistry and subject - the ability to stir the reader - is what matters in poetry.

# Variety fundraiser at Academy

"It's about community spirit and the fun of performance, and supporting the academy," says William Holland, guitarist and singer of successful Smokefreerockquest band Pseudo Sane. The band, which recently broke through to the final 20 bands in the national music competition, is in the line-up for a special event for Geraldine Academy of Performance and Arts.

With local band Zahr and solo performers Max Paterson, Jac Paterson, Brianna Lister, Niamh Cameron and Freya Bates, Pseudo Sane will play the Saturday night show to celebrate and fundraise for the local arts school, which William says "brings out people's confidence through performance", and Zahr drummer Rob Zipfel says, "adds to the artistic environment of Geraldine".

The academy has extended the capacity of performance and visual arts locally, event co-organiser Sandy Kelly says. "They're passionate and highly skilled people there: really talented. We wanted to show appreciation for the effort that goes into it. Everything's here in Geraldine. Not having to drive to Ashburton or Timaru for lessons is huge."

She says the gig "showcases local talent. It's for people to come and enjoy the music and the dancing— for everyone

to come and have a good night," as well as supporting the academy.

Geraldine Academy of Performance and Arts was established in 2012 to be "A hub: a home for the arts to allow people to learn the arts locally," says academy co-founder and co-ordinator Jill Roberts. "It's a charitable organisation, run by volunteers. Our income is fundraisers, grants and space hire: people may hire the academy for one-off events.

"We attract tutors who hire the academy hourly, to create a varied, interesting timetable. We currently have different types of dance for all ages, singing and musical lessons, speech and drama as well as improvisation, and one-off workshops at the weekends: for example, dance and singing masterclasses. There's been fencing [and] there's regular yoga, a special needs class and blackboard concerts once a month."

"The audience is getting a really good show on Saturday," says Rob. "Original songs, real talent and a lot of fun."

The academy fundraiser is at 7.30pm, Saturday 6 August, at Geraldine Academy of Performance and Arts. Tickets \$10 at the door. For more information, check the academy's Facebook page or contact Jill on 027 452 4791.

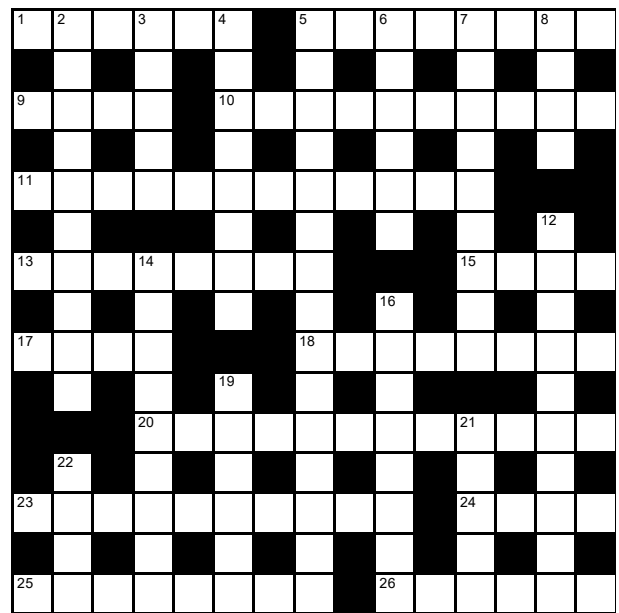

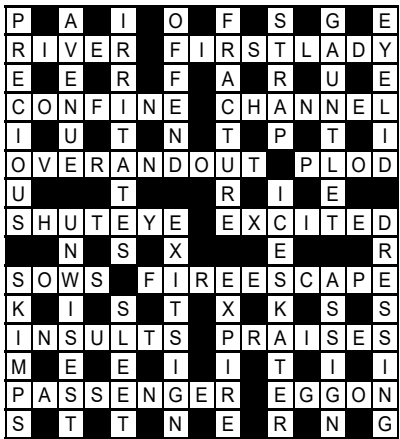

GROW YOUR OWN: Miner’s lettuce

There’s one plant I’ll never be without and, thanks to its natural ability to spread without any work from me, I have fresh salad leaves right when we’re yearning for them. It’s the annual miner’s lettuce, and it supplies a delicious salad crop from late autumn right through the winter and into early spring.

The plant originally came from the western coastal and mountain regions of North America, where it was eaten raw as a salad green. It was named miner’s lettuce back in the Californian goldrush years as miners ate it to prevent scurvy, an illness caused by prolonged deficiency in vitamin C.

It has a delightfully mild flavour, similar to lettuce, but with more succulent, slightly juicy leaves, which begin their life looking like little blades of grass and slowly changing into the shape of upside down hockey sticks. These eventually grow larger (some will grow the size of your palm) and become heart shaped.

Left to flower, it pushes a long stem out the top of its leaf, displaying a dainty white flower on the end, and eventually what must be many hundreds of tiny seeds, which it readily spreads. The leaves don’t get bitter the larger they get, and the plant enjoys damp, cool conditions – perfect for an unused shady corner of the garden. Come summer, it disappears and you wouldn’t even know the plant had been there, until

autumn when it pops up again.

What’s the best way to eat miner’s lettuce? Grab a bowl and pair of scissors. Snip as many young leaves as you wish. Add a dash of olive oil and squeeze of lemon (and a few edible flowers if they are handy), and tuck into it with a chunk of freshly baked bread. Delish. Kids don’t like eating greens? Miner’s lettuce might help change that – they are heart shaped after all.

**Tasks:**

- It may be cold but put on a hat and get to work in the vege garden. Clear out old vegetables and weeds, add large amounts of compost and manure (or blood and bone) and cover with mulch.
- Instead of digging the soil, lay everything on top to keep your worms and soil life intact.
- Plant fruit trees, prune berries, apple and pear trees and spread plenty of feed (compost, manure or fertiliser) everywhere.
- Start going through your seeds and write lists to purchase for spring plantings.
- Source early potatoes and start planting them – try Swift for spuds by Labour Day.
- Sow radishes, peas, lettuce, silverbeet and spinach.

Biodiversity funding helps protect gecko habitat

*Some of the smallest residents at the Orari Gorge got a helping hand recently thanks to a grant from the zone committee's Immediate Steps biodiversity fund.*

The committee granted \$36,500 towards a four year project to protect the gecko habitat at the Orari Gorge by tackling a number of species of pest plants.

The project will not only protect four species of Canterbury lizards, two gecko and two skink, but also a number of threatened plant and bird species.

Members of the Orari River Protection Group have been clearing weeds from the area for a number of years, but this support will lend a helping hand to access some tough to reach areas. A helicopter will be used to access the steep sides of the gorge to clear pest plants, but volunteers will continue to be the driving force behind this project.

The part of the project that is funded by the Immediate Steps programme will start this spring to coincide with the flowering of broom in the gorge so they are more visible.

The gorge is also a popular spot for swimming, fishing and picnics – so the funding boost will also help to improve the area for recreational users as well.

In September the zone committee will host evening workshops to present the science behind the project and the current state of our catchments.

**Meetings will be held in mid-September Geraldine, Timaru and Fairlie – keep an eye out on the website and in local papers for more information closer to the time.**



Local farmers focus on improving stream quality

*In June Waihi Station farmers Tim Sowden and Mark Mallison met with Environment Canterbury staff to discuss ways to improve water quality.*

The Station is a complex property with three main streams flowing into the Waihi River, which have been monitored over two years for E coli levels.

While it is not a mapped recreational swimming site, the two farmers are keen to do what they can to reduce E coli levels in the stream to make it more suitable for contact recreation.

To achieve this they will voluntarily exclude stock for a kilometre above the bathing site, restrict cattle grazing from the road area adjacent to the Waihi, and have already fenced off a steep gully and wetland.

Further ideas for managing the E.coli include a wetland construction/protection programme and developing drinking bays for stock water.

Working together on this project provides a wider understanding of the issue and helps all parties develop a solution that will protect and restore the Waihi Stream.

The zone committee supports locally-led initiatives to improve water quality for contact recreation, as outlined in it its Zone Implementation Programme.
