Crank-up day at museum

The Geraldine Vintage Car and Machinery Museum will once again resonate to the sound of elderly internal combustion engines roaring into life on Saturday 4 November.

"It's our annual crank up day," says Max Millar. "We'll have some cars available for rides, a gold-coin sausage sizzle and we'll reduce the admission fee from the normal \$15 to \$10. We'll be open from 10am to 3pm."

Graham Rae, whose job it is to keep the vehicles running says, "We mostly crank up the old tractors and stationary engines. They are the stars of the show."

Max says the club has around 80 members, 20 of whom are active, "including those who look after the door as well as the half dozen or so who work on the vehicles. Most of the members have got a vintage vehicle and our display is about 60 per cent owned by members and 40 per cent by the club, so what is on show changes from time to time. We're still acquiring vehicles, though we're running out of space."

William Turnbull says that recent progress at the club includes the nearly complete restoration of the Ford Model AA truck and a major upgrade of the Bianchi car.

The museum is open every day from 9.30am to 4.30pm.

Local fashion show

Ann Smedley is organising a fashion show to be held at St Mary's church on Wednesday 8 November.

Ann explains, "It's to raise funds for my son Robert's charity Mphatikizo [loosely translated as working together]. Robert met his Malawian wife Regina about eight years ago while he was doing aid work in Malawi. It's a desperately poor country with huge numbers of orphans because of AIDS. They felt they had to do something, so they are building an orphanage in co-operation with the local people. Because Regina is from Malawi they are able to work closely at the grass-roots level."

The New Zealand-registered charity describes itself, on its website as, "a small grass-roots charity ... two people have seen a problem in the world, asked a group of friends to give them a hand and are working together to try and find a solution to that problem. It was born from the deficiencies that Bob and Regina Smedley ... saw in the delivery of aid in Africa ..."

Geraldine Summer Fête 2017



Stover Farm's annual Geraldine Summer Fête will take place on Thursday 2 November, with the property's long-established garden at its vernal best, local musicians in two entertainment areas and a range of crafts and delicacies available at 190 stalls.

"The fête's a lovely day out," says co-organiser Deanna Mackenzie. "People can wander around and be inspired by the garden that's been created throughout several years. There are views of the Four Peaks visible from different parts of it, and there are different areas, such as a water feature, brick gardens, rhodies and the rose garden."

"The stalls are high quality, unique and there are products for everyone including women's clothing, plants, lawn mowers, children's clothing, accessories, lifestyle gifts, body products, coffee, selections of foods and wines.

"It's mainly handmade local crafts and arts, and we try to have only one or two of the same sort of thing, to spread the range. We have many new ones each year."

Among new stallholders debuting at 2017's fête are artisans and artists selling handmade fused glass art, outdoor wicker furniture, oil paintings, cushions featuring painted

wildlife images, and handcrafted purses.

"We have a variety of live music, too. Local bands will be playing in different areas, which creates lovely atmospheres. This year, we have The Drama Queens, Zoe Scott, Holly Kimber and Abbey Mackenzie."

Geraldine Summer Fête has embedded itself into the local calendar since it began in 2010. "We decided to create a fête because we have these perfect surroundings and because it benefits Geraldine. The first year there were 90 stalls – now we've got 190 with up to 2,500 people attending, drawing large crowds from a variety of locations."

The event supports local charities annually. Deanna says, "We like to donate to the community – to Geraldine St John, and Geraldine Lions and South Canterbury Hospice."

Geraldine Summer Fête will be held – "rain, hail, or shine" – 9.30am to 4pm, Thursday 2 November at Stover Farm on the Main North Road just north of Geraldine. Entry \$15 at the gate and children under 15 free. Parking is on site with disabled parking provided. "... and an overwhelming drive to help Regina's people. Our aim is not to give aid, but rather to work in partnership with those we are trying to assist."

Although holding a fashion parade in a church may be seen as unusual, Ann says, "Felicity Whitcombe [the new priest-in-charge at St Mary's] and bishop's warden Jan Hill both gave their approval. Support from the Geraldine community is wonderful. The clothes are coming from local shops Trio, The Tin Shed, and Design123. Fiona McQuade will compère the show. There has been a lot of help offered by other Geraldine businesses too.

"Over the years, Geraldine people have been very supportive of the charity's work. The local AAW [Association of Anglican Women] is very involved and there have been individual donations too. An example is the family that paid for a water pump, so the villagers no longer have to carry contaminated water from the river in buckets, but have clean fresh water."

Biodiversity boost at Dennistoun Bush

Peel Forest biodiversity restoration initiative Project Peel was launched last year. Now, with official status, partnerships and initial funding in place, it's going live on Sunday.

AgResearch and Department of Conservation (DOC) representatives and Peel Forest community members will be giving talks as well as a guided walk around the project's first work area, Dennistoun Bush.

The event will begin at the Peel Forest hall, where, project member Mike Joiner says, "There'll be information about biodiversity, plant and animal pests, pest ecology and pest control. It'll be an overview. Education is a big part of what we're doing." The Dennistoun Bush walk, focusing on the fauna and flora, will follow.

Dennistoun, a flat, 40-hectare section of Peel Forest Park Scenic Reserve, "is where we'll start the physical work," says project member Matt Searles, "because it's a small, contained area with very easy access for us and for the public so they can see the benefits of what we're trying to achieve."

The group is going to use a local weed-control contractor to do a trial within Dennistoun. "He'll grid it, see what the densities and varieties of weeds are and cost controlling them," says Mike. "We'll also set up tracking tunnels so we can get a handle on what's in there from a pest-animal perspective."

Project Peel was set up "by like-minded people, to preserve the native flora and

fauna of Peel Forest and its amenity values. We've signed a management agreement with DOC to achieve those aims." An incorporated society, the group has received funding from the Community Trust Mid and South Canterbury for its initial work stage.

Matt says they are looking for people to join them for a \$15 subscription, which goes to July 2019, and thereafter, yearly. "We'll keep members posted so they can have a

feet-on-the-ground perspective."

Project Peel goes live at Peel Forest Hall at 1.30pm on Sunday 29 October. The Dennistoun Bush part of the event starts at the Brake Road entrance. Everyone is welcome. Iain Sutherland, formerly of Geraldine, was recently named Project Manager of the Year by the Project Management Institute of New Zealand. The award was presented in September at a conference in Christchurch. There were 57 nominees.

Iain says, "I was really flattered when I heard I had been nominated and quite surprised to find out I was one of four finalists. Most of my family were there on the awards night, and it was very exciting to hear my name called out, especially with the scream of sheer delight my mother, Helen, let loose at the time."

After leaving Geraldine High School in 1993, Iain went on to study engineering. "I left [school] to study mechanical engineering at the University of Canterbury ... and stayed on to complete a masters in engineering management. This is basically an MBA but with an engineering focus, and it was my first introduction to project management."

He now works for Beca, which "includes New Zealand's largest group of specialist project-management professionals. The winner of the Emerging Project Manager of the Year award also works for Beca, so our celebrations went well into the small hours that night. Beca puts significant time and investment into the development of their people, so this outcome reflects well on how well it's working."

"The actual project which gained the award was for my delivery of a new brewery for Emerson's in Dunedin. This was a greenfield development and we transformed a longstanding eyesore and contaminated site into a brewery with architectural flair. The project has won a string of awards, and is currently a finalist in the World Architectural Festival, with the winner being announced in November in Berlin – fingers crossed for that one."

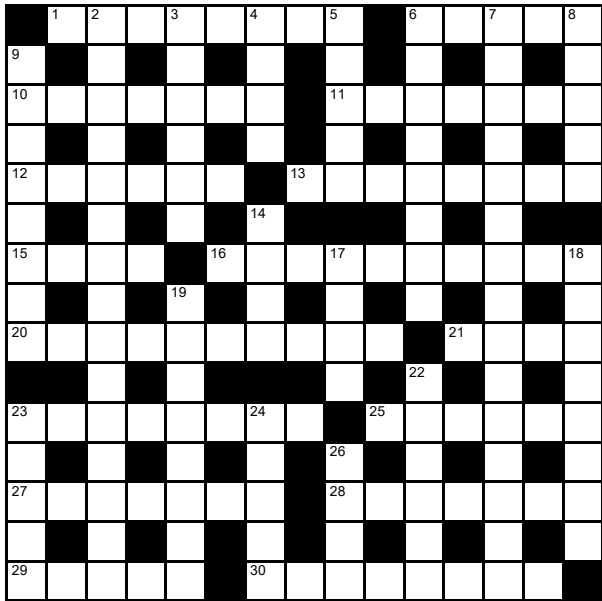

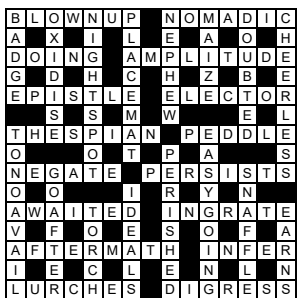

Cyclists offered big trip chance

A group of Geraldine cyclists are riding the Picton-Hokitika section of the national Tour Aotearoa cycle trail over an eight-day period in February and would like anyone interested to join them. "We're just local people, friends, who sometimes bike together, issuing an open invitation to anyone who wants to do it," says Peter Graham.

"It's a great ride, and it includes most of the West Coast Wilderness Trail, which I think is the best all-round trail in New Zealand. It'll be suitable for mountain bikes or hybrid bikes," he says.

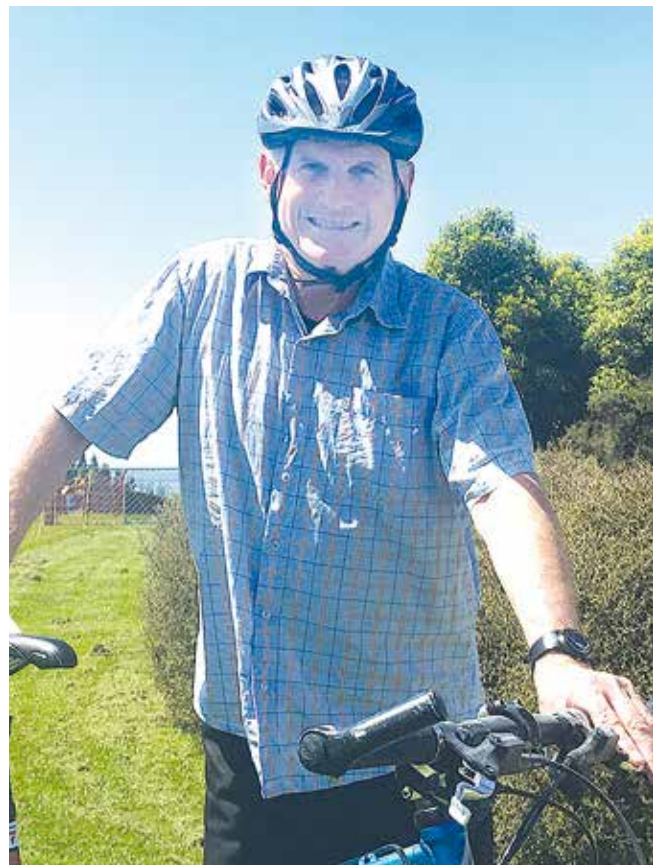
The cycling friends – Geraldine people may have spotted them riding on Saturday mornings – "have got a vehicle booked and there are places on it, but if we get more, we've got a contingency vehicle. We've got racks and plenty of space."

"We'll start in Picton and go to Havelock, then Richmond, Tapawera, Murchison via Lake Rotorua, Reefton via Maruia Saddle, Greymouth – with a mini side-trip to Blackball – and then to Hokitika. There may be some who want to ride to Ross to finish the West Coast Wilderness Trail. It's a combination of four-wheel-drive trails, cycle trails, gravel roads and some sealed road riding.

"What people will carry on bikes is just daily requirements. Baggage and camping gear will be shuttled in the support vehicle, which will be driven by volunteers, including myself and a couple of other part-time riders. I've done the ride before."

"It'll cost approximately \$200 per person for the vehicle, and there'll be personal costs: accommodation and food. It's self-catering and they'll be able to choose from a range of places to stay at the overnight stops. There's camping through to hotel accommodation at each place."

They're putting the word out now because, "People will need to train. Someone who's going to do the charity ride [Central South Island Charity Bike Ride] and is training for it will have suitable fitness. If not, they'd need to start now: three rides a week, one long – 40 kilometres – and two mediums.

"We're doing it because it's fun. It's just about being out there."
