families here today. We put on a barbecue, a few beers, speeches – a social time. These people go out to help the community in all weathers, at all times of the day and night and it affects their families. We want to show our appreciation."

Geraldine Glass has moved from its previous home, tucked in behind Talbot Street, to the Wilson Street property formerly occupied by Village Landscapes.

"John and I have been waiting for an opportunity like this for years," says joint owner Jennine Maguire. "The property we leased was a perpetual source of worry from a health and safety point of view, because customers had access to the workshop. It seems like Ray [Prouting of Village Landscapes] designed this place with us in mind."

"Once we have the front landscaped properly, the customers will arrive in front of the office and will be kept well away from the back, where the work happens. It's perfect."

John and Jennine started the business in 2002 shortly after moving to Geraldine from the West Coast. "Geraldine has been very good to us. When we went out on our own, the local builders were very supportive. Right now, we're quite busy with work from Ashburton, up to the lakes and in Timaru. We are so

Lots on for the Geraldine Museum

The Geraldine News caught up with Geraldine Historical Society co-president Sylvia Irvine and secretary Margaret Chapman to find out about Geraldine Museum’s upcoming events.

White elephant stall: 17 and 18 November

“We’re looking for donations for our annual Arts and Plants white elephant on the festival’s Friday and Saturday outside the museum. It’s one of our main, annual, general fundraisers,” says Margaret.

Sylvia says, “We welcome anything: china, furniture, paintings, cutlery, toys. People can bring them in to the museum – anything except electrical items.”

Bookarama

Margaret says, “This is in conjunction with the white elephant at Arts and Plants weekend, on the Friday and the Saturday. We’re having a bookarama: a book buy-sell-swap. It replaces the one that was at the domain pavilion at Arts and Plants in previous years.

“It’ll be held in the museum extension; it’s another fundraiser for the permanent displays – which are well underway – for that part of the museum. We’re looking for more books, which can be dropped off at the museum before Arts and Plants.”

Lily day

“This is an annual fundraiser with the ongoing support of the landowner Rosie Morten,” says Margaret. “It’s at Orari Estate on Sunday 10 December, from 10am till 4pm, with \$10 entry for adults and children free. The lilies are magnificent plants with wonderful perfume, and they’re in a lovely big rambling garden. It’s a great place to go and have some time out.”

Sylvia says, “Everyone’s welcome to take picnic lunches to have on the lawn; there are no refreshments for sale.”

Stock drive

This stock-rearing fundraiser for the museum extension’s displays has been running for two months and will be ongoing. Margaret says, “Donations of stock and grazing are coming in, but we’d like more. People can call the museum if they’re able to help.”

Plunket display

Scales, a stork, old Plunket books, patterns for babies’ clothing and other historic Royal New Zealand Plunket Society items are on display at present. Sylvia says, “It’s a temporary display showing how babies were cared for by Plunket, using donated items we’ve had in storage.”

Volunteers

“We’re short on volunteers at the moment because of health problems: we’d like some more to come on board

for two-and-a-half hour stints once or twice a month to man the desk,” says Sylvia. “People don’t have to know a lot about Geraldine; it’s more about welcoming people to the museum.”

Playground remodelling: ‘incredible how the feel has changed’

Over the school holidays, big changes were happening at Geraldine Kindergarten. Stage one of the playground remodelling is now complete. “It’s designed to encourage creative play,” says acting head teacher Ashleigh McPherson. “We’ve made a more natural environment as a way of reinforcing our connection to the local forests and the natural world. Established trees replace some shade sails for shade; we have lifted some of the concrete paths, moved the swings and replaced the fort with a grassy mound. It is incredible how the feel of the playground has changed and great to be alongside the children exploring the changes.”

The children appreciate the new-look playground too. “I like the wobbly bridge,” says Kate. “I like driving my Land Rover on the track,” says Digby. They both agree that they like the new mound to play on.

Ashleigh says that the project is a long-term one supported by the Home and Kindergarten Committee,

who have been fundraising for it for the last five years. “The Geraldine Licensing Trust supported an application to the Southern Trust, which brought in \$50,000 for which we are very grateful. Over the holiday, families have been watching the work as Village Landscapes and Hire made it happen.

“Along with other changes, the big job in stage two is to raise the grass area in the centre of the playground to improve drainage and to make for an interesting play space. The final stage will redevelop the sandpit area.”

Parts of bike trails closed for now

Tree-felling between Bennett and Vance Roads on the Ōrari River’s south bank means the temporary closure of mountain bike trails there.

Poplars and pines, planted for timber and flood protection, will be harvested “during the next few months”, according to an Environment Canterbury (ECan) press release.

Funds from the timber’s sale will go to ongoing local flood protection. The poplars will regrow and ECan may do additional plantings. Willow and other tree species will remain standing.

Bike Geraldine chair Allan Kelly says, “They’re [ECan and its contractors] doing their best to manage it so that it’s bit by bit and so there’s always something open for cyclists. And the track from Bennett Road to the Upper Ōrari Bridge, and from the bridge to Burdon Road, will still be open.”

ECan river-engineering manager David Owen says, “It’s really important that we harvest the mature trees in good conditions, so we are very grateful to the public for their patience while this section of the bike track is closed to allow us to get on with the job.”

President's Annual Report for the year ended 31 March 2017

The Geraldine Licensing Trust has continued with its focus of trading profitably, building the asset base and supporting the local community. Although the Board is keen to add to its property portfolio, no suitable properties were found, so further funds were added this year to our investment portfolio under management with Craig's Investment Partners.

In the 2017 year ending March 31 the Geraldine Licensing Trust's profit before tax was \$108,807 (2016: \$155,346). This profit was after payment of our "community dividend" of \$20,810 in sponsorship of the Geraldine Community Resource Centre, the Geraldine Historical Society, Go Geraldine's Christmas Parade and three Geraldine High School scholarships for senior students going on to tertiary study. While the before-tax profit appears to be a significant decrease from the previous year's result, it is entirely due to an accounting revaluation of the capital gains on our investment portfolio, not any failure to control expenditure or the loss of any income.

Before tax-operating revenue from our own properties was steady at \$250,107 (2016: \$257,074) with all three properties tenanted. Other income from dividends and investments was higher at \$58,984 (2016: \$47,500). General expenditure was in line with expectations, including the final expenses for the Westpac building seismic strengthening and the first of the triennial election expenses.

The Southern Trust continue to operate the gaming machines in the Village Inn and the GLT Board is very pleased to provide Southern Trust with advice and local knowledge about applicant groups in our community. Grants from the gaming machines amounting to \$218,160

were made in this financial year to many great projects in the district. The largest grant was made to Seniorcare Inc for the refurbishment of the Firman Wing at Waihi Lodge. This significant development will greatly improve the facilities provided for the elderly residents but will also ensure the on-going financial sustainability of this community owned rest-home. An initial payment in this financial year of \$50,000 was paid by Southern Trust and a further \$50,000 has been committed for early in the next financial year as well.

Other groups receiving grants were: Geraldine RSA, Geraldine Archery Club, Geraldine Squash Club, Geraldine Combined Hockey Club, Geraldine Croquet Club, Geraldine Primary School - Life Education, Geraldine Scouts, Timpson Peel Forest Trust - Pre-School, Geraldine High School, Geraldine Bowling Club, Geraldine Combined Sports, Geraldine Primary School - Furniture, Geraldine Players, Geraldine Cricket Club, Geraldine Rugby Club.

The GLT Trustees are elected every three years in accordance with the Local Government Act. Two members, Lindsay Robertson and Shaun Cleverley, did not stand for re-election in 2016, creating two vacancies. As only two nominations were received no election was required and Dan Cummings and McGregor Simpson joined the Board in November.

Soon after the new Board met for its first meeting our President, Ian Morten, died after a very brief illness. Ian had served the GLT diligently for 15 years, approximately 12 of those years as President. When he joined the GLT had many issues to contend with, particularly relating to its solvency and the public's perception of its value to the community. Ian rose to the challenges that the

GLT faced because he understood the benefits that the GLT, as the holder of the community's assets, could provide to the district. The present financial health of the GLT is a testament to his long-term view, wisdom and determination. The Board extends our sincere condolences to Ian's wife, Rosie, and other members of the Morten family. Ian will be greatly missed.

Ian's death necessitated a by-election to fill his place. Only one nomination was received, that of Jo Hewson who joined the Board at our June meeting. The GLT is required by legislation to have six elected Trustees and, if the last 12 months has provided us any lessons it is that, the Board must be much more pro-active in identifying suitable candidates and encouraging them to stand for election. An election is always a desirable outcome of the democratic process as it ensures the Board's accountability to the community. There is room for multiple talents and views at the Board table but the GLT really does need to ensure its succession going forward with new members stepping up.

I thank my fellow Trustees, past and present (Andrew Johnstone, Alister France, Dan Cummings, Jo Hewson, McGregor Simpson, Lindsay Robertson and Shaun Cleverley), for their commitment to the Geraldine Licensing Trust, and thank them for supporting me as I transition to the role of President. Also thanks to Anne Marett who acts as Board Secretary and her team at Croys Ltd for their attention to GLT matters.

I have a good team, and I look forward to us building on the legacy that Ian Morten and prior Boards have given us to continue to support the Geraldine community.


