CBD refresh on board's agenda

At their November meeting, Geraldine Community Board members considered a Remuneration Authority report on the way they are paid. They also heard about a \$600,000 district-wide Central Business District (CBD) refresh with a lead-in workshop on 30 November.

Last Wednesday, board members Janene Adams, Jan Finlayson, Jennine McGuire, Jarrod Marsden, Wayne O'Donnell, Gavin Oliver and Cr Kerry Stevens met for the last time in 2017. Also in attendance were Timaru District Council's CEO Bede Curran, land transport manager Andrew Dixon, council secretary Joanne Brownie and Mayor Damon Odey.

Remuneration Authority report. The extensive Remuneration Authority report provided background information and sought feedback on the methods by which elected local body representatives are paid.

It explains that nearly half of New Zealand's territorial authorities and unitary councils have community boards and the boards' delegated authorities vary widely.

The community boards in the Timaru district are paid out of the general rate. Some other councils with community boards pay them out of a targeted rate on the wards that the community boards represent. The Geraldine board expressed its support for the status quo.

Discussion on the method of remuneration led to a wider discussion of efforts to encourage more people – and especially more young people – to participate in local body governance.

Cr Stevens said that being on a community board, "doesn't actually pay enough to make it worthwhile. Encouraging people into governance roles requires fair, equitable and transparent remuneration."

Jan Finlayson said, "There's a public service component in this role. It's hard to strike a balance between a token amount and fair remuneration."

CBD refresh. The council's annual plan explains the CBD refresh. It "provides for a freshen up of the Central Business Districts in Timaru and rural townships. It was to commence in 2015/16 but has been

rescheduled to 2016/17 awaiting the District Town Centre (DTC) project completion. The DTC project sets the strategy for future development of town centres. Once adopted, CBD refresh works will be undertaken," the plan notes.

Mayor Odey says a wide range of organisations have been invited to the lead-in workshop, which will be run by an independent facilitator on 20 November.

"We'll gather the inputs of everyone interested. Those ideas may feed into the long-term plan and council will then decide how to proceed."

Mayor Odey suggested \$65-75,000 might be spent in Geraldine. "We have high hopes for Geraldine."

Board chair Wayne O'Donnell expressed his confidence in the amount of input likely from Geraldine ratepayers.

"Are we looking at seats, signage and lights, maybe? It would be unusual if Geraldine wasn't vocal about this."

The Mayor explained priorities would need to be balanced...continued on page 2

Jason excels again at world lefties

Geraldine's Jason Leary completed a full set of podium results at the World Association of Left-handers' Golf (WALG) tournament in Melbourne last month. In three outings at the prestigious event, he has now finished first, second and third.

Jason's previous successes were achieved on New Zealand courses. As a "21-year-old whippersnapper", he won the open grade at Harewood in 1993 and in 2008 he finished third when the WALG was played in Queenstown.

This year, the WALG tournament was contested over a range of championship courses around Melbourne. The golfers in the open grade played the Huntingdale, Woodlands, The National and Spring Valley courses. Jason shot 74, 80, 74 and 74 for a 72-hole total of 302. This put him well behind the runaway winner, Western Australian John

Boulton, who shot 282, but comfortably clear of the 80-odd other open-grade golfers from around the world.

"I was pretty pleased with the way I played, except for the 80. I hadn't played a lot of golf in the lead-up because I've been busy putting up schist at home."

Jason is a Geraldine businessman and father of three. His responsibilities to his young children, Angus, Zach and Sasha, mean that he struggles to find the time to play a lot of golf. Playing on a handicap of one means he's expected to play par golf whenever and wherever he competes.

"I play when I can fit it in. I think my last full round before the WALG tournament was back in April sometime. I'm lucky that my wife Bid is happy for me to go away and play the occasional tournament, ...

... among the CBDs of Timaru and the rural towns but added, "It's 20 years since the CBDs were done up. We need to get on and spend this money, especially in the rural wards."

Gavin Oliver asked if the amount to be spent might be boosted by tourist funding. The mayor explained that the tourist funds were for infrastructure only and they are contestable.

Jan Finlayson said, "Ad hoc things happen and they add up to stuff. This is an opportunity to think about how we present ourselves."

The meeting concluded with members reporting on their activities in the community. About a dozen community organisations and a number of individual community members had had contact with a community board member in the last six weeks.

Michelle says Fashion in the Field provides an opportunity for people to really dress up but it is also open to those that just want to have some fun.

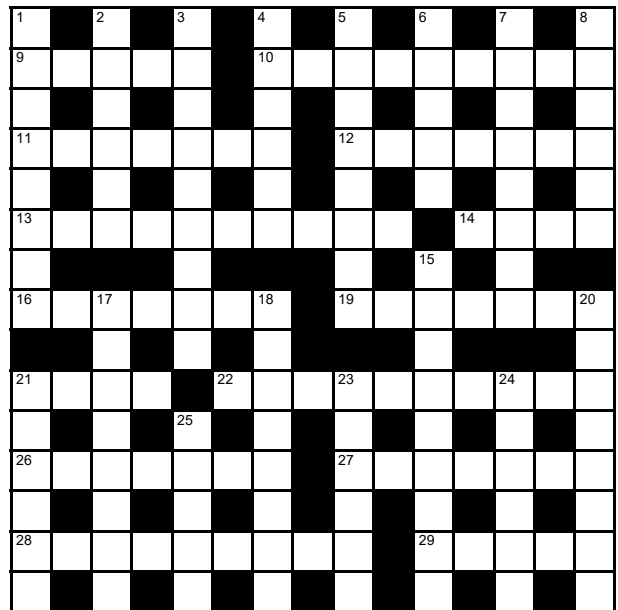

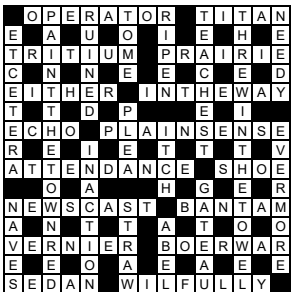

Former Geraldine woman to officiate at Commonwealth Games

Dedicated to hockey since childhood, former Geraldine woman Jackie Tomlinson (nee Hutchins) says her progress

through umpiring and officiating to her recent appointment as a 2018 Commonwealth Games technical official can be traced back to the advice of her childhood hockey coach.

"I grew up in Geraldine and Nikki Metcalf was my hockey coach; she said we needed to give something back – that's how I remember it – and she used to take a group of us into Timaru to learn how to umpire. We started umpiring primary-school hockey at Ashbury Park and went from there," says Jackie, now a mathematics teacher in Palmerston North.

In April next year, Jackie will be overseeing women's matches at the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games in a vital role that's largely unseen by games' spectators. "Technical officials have to have attention to detail. We manage the sideline and the behaviour of teams and coaches, we record events – goals, substitutions, suspensions – and we run shootouts and we're the first stop for protests."

The technical official's role is senior to that of umpires and judges, and just a step below

the tournament director's position, which Jackie has held at the national level.

Former coach Nikki says, "To be a technical official, you've got to have a good understanding of the rules and an air of confidence about you. Jackie had the personality for it and she's just taken it from there."

Hockey officiating has kept Jackie close to her sport since finishing as a player. She says, "I was a better umpire than player, and I'm a better technical official than umpire. Doing this was a way to continue in a sport I really loved."

Nikki says, "It's good for people to see there are different things you can do in sport, not just be a player."

This month, Jackie will work in Auckland as a judge for the finals of the Hockey World League; played over a two-year period, the competition will bring the top eight teams internationally together for its culmination. The matches will screen on Sky Sport.

"We worked together in cafés and I wanted to set up a home-catering business but couldn't get my home kitchen registered. Jackie Nelson approached me to set up a business in this building. Our financial

advisor said 'don't do cafés', but we were at a phase of life where we needed a change so we ignored that advice. We knew what people wanted and have been incredibly well supported."

As for the future Sue says, "I might even retire." Robyn says, "We've certainly earned time for a rest and a recharge."
