## Community highlights of 2017

### January

#### Guides and Pippins



Geraldine Guides and Pippins went into recess this year because leaders could not be found.

In January, Geraldine Guiding co-ordinator Trudie Banks said the need for volunteers to step up was dire.

"We could very well be facing the end of guiding in Geraldine."

## March

## April

### Raukapuka Ruler



The field for the New Zealand Derby at Addington Raceway in April included a horse with very strong Geraldine connections. Raukapuka Ruler (Bettor's Delight-Miss Elsie) is owned by a syndicate including Dean Oliver, Gavin Oliver, Giles Patrick, Mark Weaver, and Craig/John Pierce, all former Raukapuka residents.

Raukapuka Ruler – or Harvey as he is known in the stables of trainer Cran Dalgety – has won six of his 10 career starts. He finished an unlucky 4th in the Derby in April.

After an injury-induced spell he resumed racing at the Geraldine trots in November. As he regained fitness his owners were expecting big things in his season as a four-year-old.

### Rosemary for remembrance



Each ANZAC Day, after the parade in Geraldine, Elaine Kay and a group of ladies make their way to the cemetery and place a sprig of rosemary on each of the graves of returned servicemen. "We make 200 sprigs: 175 sprigs for Geraldine and the rest for Woodbury. Some graves go back to the Boer War," she said.

Then, rain or shine, Elaine stands under the flag and recites The Ode. As far as anyone can remember, the women's section has honoured the dead in this way since its inception in 1941.

Because of aging membership and dwindling numbers, the organisation became informal in 2014. Elaine fears that arthritic fingers will soon make the job of tying poppies on to rosemary too much for the few that remain. She was not sure they can continue beyond this year. "I hope some other people will come forward to do this job," Elaine said.

## Double celebration

Bianca saw social work as a privilege. "I have great respect for the people I work with. Some of them show amazing resilience and skill... Social work is a collaborative effort as we seek a shared understanding of the issues in order to find ways of making the situation better."

Bianca will finish working for Community Wellness next week but the trust hopes to appoint a replacement social worker because the need still exists in Geraldine.

## Using recycled bottles



Nikau room (years 4 and 5) at Winchester Rural School was knee deep in bottles when class teachers Jacqui Coombs and Mary Orsler helped their students prepare 1,600 plastic bottles for threading onto bamboo poles.

Caretaker Clive Scott then supervised the assembling of the bottle strings to make a greenhouse.

The greenhouse is the brainchild of Paula Kane who heads up Gardening Gurus, a project that has operated at the school since last September.

"The idea is to promote healthy eating," said Paula. "Children grow, cook and share food so they understand about food and how to make healthy food choices."

## Milestone anniversary



The Geraldine Tramping Club had its first excursion, on 3 July 1977, when members walked up Huatekerekere/Little Mount Peel. The group celebrated the anniversary in June this year with a rare dinner in urban surrounds; usually, meals together are in tussock or in the comfort of a hut.

## Lilies, art and music at Mount Peel

With its Himalayan lilies (*Cardiocrinum giganteum*) at their flowering peak, Mt Peel Station is opening its garden gates in support of the Anglican parish of Geraldine this Sunday.

"It's a magnificent garden and lily day is a wonderful day out," says parish warden Belinda McKenzie. "The lilies are beautiful and there'll be artists working in the garden, Morris dancers, music, Himalayan lilies for sale and there'll be morning and afternoon teas available.

"It's an annual fundraiser for the Geraldine parish. There are five churches to look after: St Anne's in Pleasant Valley, St Mary's, St Thomas' at Woodbury, St Stephen's at Peel Forest, and the Holy Innocents right there at Mount Peel. The Holy Innocents has been restored after the earthquakes and this day is also a chance to look at the church."

The garden is extensive and long-established: its shade suit the lilies and summer visitors alike. Co-owner Rose Acland says, "The day's a lovely time for wandering around the garden, watching the artists and listening to the singing on the verandah."

She invites people to a service in the newly-rededicated church "It's at 10am – morning worship. Because of lily day, it's being held here: a special service."

For visitors interested in Mount Peel's background, Belinda says, "Johnny [Acland] and Rose will give talks – at 11am and 2pm at the church – about the history of the place including the church, the lilies and other aspects of the station."

The lily day is 10am to 4pm, Sunday 17 December. Entry fee is \$15 at the gate on Rangitata Gorge Road and school-aged children are free. The event is signposted from Peel Forest.

## Ryan Marsden: South Island saloon champion

Driving the car that fronted Geraldine's 2017 Christmas parade, Ryan Marsden recently (SUB: 2 December) scored double at Cromwell's Central Motor Speedway, taking the South Island saloon-racing championship and breaking the track's lap record.

"It's a prestigious title, the South Island saloon title," says Central Motor president Daryl Ainsley. "The whole event was based around it. There were four support grades. Ryan won all three saloon heats; he thoroughly deserved the title."

Ryan says, "There were 26 cars and six guys who really stood out. We raced across three heats and won the championship... gave them a good pizzling, actually. And I broke the record for the track in the first heat and got pretty close in the next race." His new saloon record time is 16.72 seconds on the quarter-mile track.

Aside from Ryan as driver, the main factors in this success are the car and the mechanical expertise of Ryan's father, Miles. "It's a purpose-built saloon car, made to fit New Zealand's rules. It's probably one of the quicker ones in the country," says Ryan.

"It's a Lovelady [racecar brand]. John Lovelady in Darfield builds racecars for a living, mostly for New

Zealand speedway. We get it as a bare chassis and put everything inside. Dad built the motor – everything, really. The panels are draped over to make it look like a production car. It looks like a Ford Mustang, but it's a token gesture."

What's next? "The New Zealand saloon champs at Woodford Glen in January.

"After that, this car's being sold and I'll move up to super saloons. They've got half as much power again. It'll be a new Lovelady Mustang – bigger and just better for the next grade up. It's about higher performance, bigger tyres, more complicated suspension [and] the tunability of all sorts of things, even when I'm driving.

"With super saloons, everything happens faster. This car's 360 cubic inches. The super saloon will be 419 cubic inches."

Daryl says it's the right step. "As far as the New Zealand saloon title goes, Ryan'll be up there, definitely. But the change to super saloons is a good move: there'll be more he can do."

What's it all about, this motorsport? "It's very exciting," Ryan says. "And pretty addictive. And it's social – there's usually a minimum of three or four of us [to tend to the car] and often my family."

# Respected principal leaves school in good heart

“Her tenure at Woodbury School has been such a great success. She has been an excellent principal on every level.” Keith Tyler-Smith, the school’s board chair describes retiring principal Claire Haugh in terms that carry with it respect and admiration: sentiments shared by staff, students and community. “When she arrived, the school was very close to being shut down. The roll was 25 but now stands at a capped 106. This is an incredible statistic, but not the whole story.”

Claire says, “When I accepted the position, in 2009, I had a clear vision of how the school and community needed to grow together.”

Leaving Waihi School as the senior teacher, she brought with her a teaching and learning pedagogy that was not only based on the most effective and up-to-date teaching strategies, but also a wealth of practical experience. Armed with the wide and varied skills learnt from a stint as a director of the Hawea Irrigation Company, a consultant for a fashion designer, a farmer, a mother and 26 years of teaching, Claire was determined to save Woodbury School.

“The crucial factor was to regain the confidence and commitment of the community,” says Claire, “and that result could only be achieved by openness and effective communication. The creation of the Woodbury School Support Group and its support throughout the years has strengthened the school’s recovery and growth. The community’s engagement has been fantastic.”

Claire says one of her goals was to create an open environment for parents, where they felt welcomed and listened to. The key for any development and success as a school, she says, has to be communication and involvement.

Bevan Brown, from the support group, says Claire’s drive and engagement “encouraged the growth and development of established events, like the pet parade and the triathlon, as well as new fundraising projects. We will really miss her. She has had a very positive effect on this community.”

He was particularly impressed with one of Claire’s achievements: the renovation and building project that created a modern learning environment for children and teachers. “Her communication skills and practical common sense not only got the tradespeople to enthusiastically support her, but the project was finished on time and on budget.”

Claire says, “I have been incredibly fortunate to have had such a supportive and hardworking board over the last eight-

and-a-half years. It has been an exciting and rewarding journey for us all.”

Supported by the board of trustees, Claire also encouraged adventure play and experiential education such as hut building where, “Kids learn by doing and exploring their creativity. This has so many benefits in terms of developing personal skills in communication, socialising, planning and self-worth.”

“The staff are fantastic. From a staff of just Maureen Bromwich and myself, we now have five teaching staff who are wonderful to work with. They are highly talented and are committed to the kids and the school. It has been such a pleasure working with them and all the support staff over the years.”

“We have all created and embedded a strong and important culture at Woodbury, and it is important to me that it continues. I’m glad that I have achieved what I set out to do. I’ve loved it and it has been a great privilege to have had this role, but, after 35 years of teaching, I know when it is the right time to let go of the reins. It’s time to go.”

# DOC recommendations for summer camping and hiking

Summer recreation in our own backyard ranges from quiet close-to-home camping to above-the-bushline endeavour, says Chris Dyson, the Department of Conservation's Geraldine recreation supervisor. "There's so much to do; it's so good where we live," he says. Here are Chris' summer picks.

**Campgrounds.** "Waihi Gorge [campsite] is the place to be this summer for caravans, housebuses, etcetera. It's really tidy, and we have a camp host out there. It's open, with plenty of room, and you can have a paddle in the river.

"Ōrari Gorge [campsite] is better for tenting, and there's the track – a loop track through regenerating bush – that takes about one-and-a-half to two hours.

"There's easy access to the camps from Geraldine – they're just 20 minutes from home and both are good for picnics. It's family friendly stuff."

**Little Mount Peel.** "It's a good trip, Little Mount Peel. You can go up Deer Spur or, for more experienced tramps, the south ridge. There are great views of the local mountains, the plains and, for keen people, the sunrise.

"The reserve has a nice mix of bush below – old podocarp and broadleaf – running through to tussock and subalpine terrain above."

**Mount Somers.** "Mount Somers is a great place: an old volcano. There are opportunities for walkers, rock climbers and hunters. There's the whole Mount Somers Track or you can just go as far as Woolshed Creek hut. Woolshed Creek is straightforward for families and inexperienced tramps.

"From Woolshed Creek hut, you can visit the water caves [boulder features] and the Emerald Pool on Morgan Stream and, close by, people can do the Miners Track or the Rhyolite Ridge.

"There's the south-face walk, which has some of the nicest beech forest in our area. There are views to the mountains and Canterbury plains. It's a really good day walk or for access to the summit."

**ŌTū Wharekai.** With the Ashburton lakes – Heron, Clearwater, Camp and others – at its heart, "This is a family friendly Canterbury high country area with plenty to do.

"Double Hut and Mānuka Hut are within two hours' walk. Boundary Creek hut's three to four hours' walk.

"The area's great for mountain biking and horse riding too and Lake Clearwater's popular for windsurfing – especially when the nor'wester's blowing – and kayaking. It's a playground up there."

It's also a popular fishing area: there are trout in Lakes Clearwater and Heron and salmon in Lake Heron.

And check out the birds in the area, says Chris. Wrybills, southern crested grebes, Caspian and black-fronted terns, black-billed gulls, banded dotterels and others make this intermontane basin their home.

**Mount Sunday.** Up the Hakatere Potts Road from the Ashburton lakes is this small hill, best known as the site of Edoras in Peter Jackson's *The Lord of the Rings: The Two Towers*. "It's a great day out for families. You're in the backcountry, but you're only half an hour from your car. It's stunning up there." The wider area has been proposed for World Heritage listing.

**Upper Rangitāta.** Still further inland, Chris says, "There's the upper Rangitāta and the Clyde, the Lawrence and the Havelock. It's right up near the main divide: Canterbury headwaters country. It's huge landscape up there – great country for experienced hunters and tramps."

**Backcountry tramping from the Rakaia to Lake Tekapo.** "For experienced tramps, there's Rakaia River to Lake Heron on the Te Araroa Trail," says Chris. "Other objectives from the Rakaia are Tribulation and Cookies Huts; they're great little musters' huts and they're up to DOC standards. They're not on the Te Araroa, so they're quieter. They're good for overnight tramps.

"And then, there's Mesopotamia to Lake Tekapo on the Te Araroa. It's a great multi-day tramp. This stuff is big, wide-open Canterbury high country – big tussock country."

### Choosing a sunscreen

"Consumer NZ chief executive Sue Chetwin says that out of the 19 products tested, only nine sunscreens met their SPF label claim and the requirements for broad-spectrum protection." (*Consumer*, 1 December 2017)

Geraldine pharmacist Peter Shenoda says, "My biggest concern is that sunscreens are still classified as cosmetics, therefore there is no obligation for sunscreens to be tested before being out on the market. As we're heading into summer, sunscreens become a necessity. As a health professional and a responsible retailer, I have an obligation to only stock what is guaranteed to work."

While some of the 10 products were only marginally deficient, *Consumer* says only the following products fully met their claims for SPF protection and broad spectrum:
